- I. the principal registrar of the Magistrates' Court;
- m. a registrar of the Magistrates' Court;
- n. a deputy registrar of the Magistrates' Court;
- o. the registrar of probates;
- p. an assistant registrar of probates;
- q. the associate to a judge of the Supreme Court;
- r. the associate to a judge of the County Court;
- s. the secretary of a master of the Supreme Court;
- t. the secretary of a master of the County Court;
- u. a person registered as a patent attorney under Part XV of the Patents Act 1952 of the Commonwealth;
- v. a member of the police force;
- w. the sheriff;
- x. a deputy sheriff;
- y. a member or former member of either House of the Parliament of Victoria;
- z. a member or former member of either House of the Parliament of the Commonwealth:
- aa. a councillor of a municipality;
- bb. a senior officer of a Council as defined in the Local Government Act 1989;
- cc. a registered medical practitioner within the meaning of the Medical Practice Act 1994;

- gg. a principal in the teaching service;
- hh. the manager of an authorised deposit-taking institution;
- ii. a member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia, the Australian Society of Accountants or the National Institute of Accountants;
- jj. the secretary of a building society;
- kk. a minister of religion authorised to celebrate marriages;
- II. a person employed under Part 3 of the *Public Administration Act 2004* with a classification that is prescribed as a classification to which this section applies or who hold office in a statutory authority with such a classification;
- mm. a fellow of the Institute of Legal Executives (Victoria)
